



## **Registration of Purebred Lipizzaner Progeny from Imported Semen**

The following information has been prepared to assist LAA members considering using imported frozen semen as part of their Lipizzaner breeding program. To ensure progeny is eligible for registration in the LAA Stud Book the following checklist must be complied with. While much of the obligation lies with the importer of the semen, mare owners are encouraged to ensure they have the necessary documentation for registering their foal.

Any person wishing to breed a foal this way and have it registered at any time in this country, must be a current financial member of the LAA before beginning the process.

Note: AQIS refers to the Australian Quarantine and Inspection Service which has set rules for the importation of frozen semen.

### **Part A**

- Copies of the importation documentation of the semen
- Copies of the DNA result for each stallion, and the AQIS approved Veterinarian's confirmation that this semen comes from this stallion.
- Copies of the accreditation assessment of the stallion.
- Five generation pedigree of the stallion.
- The above documentation will be required before mares are inseminated in Australia, with a Notice of Intention to Artificially Inseminate, using imported semen (download from LAA website).

### **Part B**

- Service certificates from the stud that owns the stallion for each and every mare that is inseminated.
- Copies of all certificates of service provided by the inseminating Vet in this country when using frozen semen.
- Stud returns for all mares that are inseminated.
- LAA Stud Service certificates.
- The above to be provided before 31 July of the applicable stud season.
- Late fees apply
